The purpose of the event is to discuss and define the current role and future potential of technological, medical physics and molecular/biological innovations for routine clinical practice in patient-centred radiation oncology. The event will be held in English.

Submissions of papers using InTouch+ can only be considered if received by the deadline indicated in Section O of the Announcement and Call for Papers.
